



Kearns Arts Town Hall

Meeting Report

June 2021

In Summary

Introduction: On May 24th, 2021, the first Kearns Arts Town Hall was held. This event was hosted in partnership with Kearns Metro Township, Greater Salt Lake MSD, and Utah Division of Arts & Museums (UDAM). The Town Hall was facilitated over Zoom and took place from approximately 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM.

Purpose: The purpose of this event was to begin gaging residents' interest in arts and culture programming in Kearns. Staff and partners wanted to understand what arts and culture amenities already exist in the community and what additional programs, amenities, or services were needed to support residents. In addition, this event served as a first step in understanding whether a Local Arts Agency (LAA) would be of interest to the Kearns community.

Attendees: The Arts Town Hall was well-attended for a virtual event, with eleven members of the public, two regional partners, two facilitators, and seven additional staff members. Overall, attendees represented a diverse segment of Kearns' population, including youth, artists, community leaders, and elected officials.

Key Takeaways: Several overarching themes emerged from this event.

- Participants showed strong interest in advancing arts, culture, and history in Kearns. They recognized the potential of the arts to activate spaces, provide recreational and educational value, and contribute to the identify of Kearns.
- Several important community partners participated in the event and expressed their support for these efforts. Present partners included: the Kearns Library, Salt Lake County Zoo, Arts & Parks (ZAP), and Salt Lake County Arts & Culture.
- Kearns and nearby municipalities do have assets that we can leverage to advance this work, including the Element Event Center (Kearns), Kearns Library, local parks, and the Mid-Valley Performing Arts Center (Taylorsville).
- Despite the aforementioned, participants felt there were few venues available for visual arts in Salt Lake Valley.
- Although existing programming in Kearns is limited, local artists seemed to know each other – indicating the presence of an organic community that could be utilized to help expand these efforts.
- Participants were extremely interested in preserving, showcasing, and engaging with Kearns' history through the arts.
- Several participants indicated that they wanted to see arts and culture programming used to engage diverse and underserved residents in planning and decision-making. The group discussed the importance of the arts for welcoming and including people of various backgrounds and identities.
